
Changes in Britain

The Romans

English

Using what we found out by exploring a Roman soldier's box of kit, we will be writing diary entries on the day to day life a soldier in Roman Britain. We will use noun phrases, fronted adverbials and conjunctions to make our writing really interesting.



Then we will create a non-chronological report based on the Changes in Britain, we will base this work around the book "A Street Through Time".

Maths

In Maths, we will learn Roman numerals and explore the ways that these are still used today! We will be focusing on reading time on both an analogue and digital clock and will compare this to the ways that the Romans measured time.

This term we will be focusing on place value. This is fundamental as it informs mathematical work with across the four operations.

Throughout the year, we will be focusing on our times tables up to 12 x 12 and will use a range of strategies to practice these every day.

Geography

In Geography we will be locating which areas of Europe the Romans invaded during their rule and explore areas of Britain in which wonderful artefacts and sites have been found which give us more information about the Romans.

This will include a trip to the Corinium museum in Cirencester, where we will see for ourselves some of the fantastic Roman artefacts found here in Gloucestershire!

History

We will be journeying into life in Britain during Roman rule over 2000 years ago!

We will explore the reasons as to why they invaded Britain and discover what life was like as a Roman soldier.

We will also compare life today to those living in the Roman towns and settlements and identify some of the fantastic inventions that we still use today!

<u>Art</u>

This term we are going to be focusing on shading and proportion to improve our drawing skills. We will explore the wonderful mosaics Roman homeowners used to decorate their floors and will use these to design and create our own!



<u>Science</u>

Our first topic this term focuses on the human body, including the special functions of our digestive system and the role of different types of teeth. We will explore the Roman diet, comparing it to our own, to find out how out it's different effects on the body.
